More than 400 Women Swim, Bike, and Run

The 16th Barbara Schmidt Millar Celebration of Life Triathlon at Cascade Shores

Nothing all year fills our Cascade Shores corner of the world more than the Barbara Schmidt Millar Triathlon. The 16th iteration of a great tradition was a cool day. Over 400 participants and a thousand supporters instilled the "Celebration of Life" that is part of the event's title. The weather was cool, too -- good conditions for athletes ranging from the minimum age allowed – 18 – to a few in their 70s. Some people entered only one of the 3 legs. Some covered the 3 stages in teams of 3. The winner, for the sixth time in a row, was Wenn Murphy, age 29, of Nevada City. Several of the top 10 finishers were in their 30's 40's, 50's, and the tenth place finisher's age is 60. We're talking a half-mile swim, an 11-mile bike ride, and a 3-mile run. Whatever the time, what a satisfaction to finish or just to be connected to it. The event has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars helping women locally to fight breast cancer.

Organizers led the athletes in pre-triathlon stretching (top right photo). While most swimmers walked, some ran from the water (top left photo) to the bike staging area (right side, middle photo). The two-mile mark (middle photo) of the 3-mile run ends the last steep climb of a very challenging event.

What About That New Sewer Plant?

The Cascade Shores sewer plant has been rebuilt and is on-line. Most of the effluence has passed California's quality standards and is in compliance with national Clean Water Act.

However, even though construction on the plant was completed almost a year ago, it was fraught with problems. Design and engineering issues delayed it being fully operational until recently.

Scott Joslyn, Nevada County's Wastewater Operations Manager and a wastewater engineer, says the company that constructed the plant used specifications from a much larger design and reduced them to fit the much smaller design of the Cascade Shore's plant.

In doing so, the specs became confusing and uneven. Joslyn explained: "I came to Nevada Country after the plant was built and did not scrutinize the plant's design. I have been "tweaking" things for several months to bring it on-line to compliance."

Joslyn also said that the one mineral that doesn't measure up to the state standards is copper. He doesn't know where the standard coverage amount gets into the wastewater. "I contacted NID and its spokesperson said that copper is not added to the drinking water. (Sometimes copper comes in an algicide solution to clean water pipes.) Maybe, the excess copper comes from household water pipes." He said that, in any case, there are solutions that filter and thus dilute the copper from the wastewater that will ultimately conform to state standards.

With the plant on-line and working, the state has forgiven \$483,000 in fines accrued before it was built.

The new sewage treatment plant is like a state of the art intestinal system. It uses ultraviolet, aerobic, anaerobic and other nontoxic mechanisms. Labels on various subsystems indicate things like "Sludge-Free Water," "CIP Return" (Clean-In-Place), "UF Backwash" Inlet and Outlet (UltraFiltration), all toward producing our pristine effluent. This treated stuff flows out of our new plant at about 25 gallons per minute, compared with about 150 gpm at Lake Wildwood.
